Appendix D

Calculation of An Index of Content Validity (CVI) of MAQLQ

An Index of Content Validity is calculated by using the formula (Davis, 1992).

CVI = number of items ranked from "quite relevant"
and "highly relevant" by both reviewers / total items.

CVI value for each pair of five experts is calculated, and then the average CVI value is gained by dividing sum of all CVI values with 10.

CVI between expert A and B = 51/52 = 0.98 Using the same method, CVI between each pair of experts are as follows:

Expert A and B = 51/52 = 0.98

Expert A and C = 51/52 = 0.98

Expert A and D = 49/52 = 0.94

Expert A and E = 50/52 = 0.96

Expert B and C = 52/52 = 1

Expert B and D = 50/52 = 0.96

Expert B and E = 51/52 = 0.98

Expert C and D = 50/52 = 0.96

Expert C and E = 51/52 = 0.98

Expert D and E = 49/52 = 0.94

The average CVI

=(0.98+0.98+0.94+0.96+1+0.96+0.98+0.96+0.98+0.94)/10=0.972
